
- ❖ Working to bring all the pieces together- creating systems that ensure availability and access to a broad, flexible array of effective, evidence-informed, community based services for young children and their families

 - ✓ Grants for 2 Communities to Focus on a System of Services for Young Children
 - ✓ Family Preservation Services grant focused on preventing young children in the child protection system from being removed from their homes
